University of California Student Mental Health: System Initiatives, Partnerships and Clinical Experience

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Mental health challenges can negatively impact the lives of college students affecting their quality of life, academic performance, physical health, and relationships among many other experiences during this chapter of their lives. College campuses play a critical role in intervening early in the onset of a mental health condition—decreasing the risk of mental health challenges and fostering well-being by identifying and understanding trends in college students' mental health, including developing programs and services to address student needs, and creating campus partnerships to emphasize a culture of wellness. Recent data will be presented that reflects the state of college students' mental health, systemwide initiatives and efforts by the University of California to address students' needs.

KAYLA ROSEN, MD, is a psychiatrist at the University of California, Santa Barbara, Student Health Services. She received her MD from the University of Pennsylvania and completed her psychiatry residency training at Harvard Medical School in the Massachusetts General Hospital and McLean Hospital program. Her interests include innovative approaches to psychiatric crises, Dialogic Practice, integrated care, underserved populations, humanities and medicine, perinatal mental health, and eating disorders.



DR. EDWIN FELICIANO is a psychiatrist and the Behavioral Health Director at UCSB Student Health Services. He previously served as the Medical Director of the Alcohol, Drug, and Mental Health Services Department for Santa Barbara County. His primary interest is in issues of access to healthcare for individuals with psychiatric and substance use disorders, and the integration of mental health, substance use, and medical services in primary care settings. Dr. Feliciano's training

includes a psychiatry residency at Albert Einstein Medical Center in Philadelphia and Trenton Psychiatric Hospital in New Jersey, where he was chief resident.
