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CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

ELIGIBILITY

A research idea or concept can be presented as long as a clear objective or need for a collaborator to implement the project is described. A research study that is in progress or does not yet have final results available will also be considered.

- An abstract may be submitted by graduate students*, postdoctoral fellows, residents, clinicians, physicians, and university faculty or staff.
- Staff from nonprofit organizations, hospitals or other government agencies are encouraged to apply.
- Researchers from for-profit companies will be invited to apply.
- All others are ineligible.
 - *Abstracts will not be accepted from undergraduates

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Applicants must list all authors of the abstract in the application form. Multiple abstract entries from an individual are not allowed.
- An abstract must be submitted by the required deadline. No edits, new versions or substitutions allowed after the submission deadline.
- Abstract topic must relate to one of the three subject category descriptions found in original call for abstracts.
- All information submitted must be non-confidential. Any abstract that contains patient Personal Health Information (PHI) or Personally Identifiable Information (PII) will be disqualified.
- The presentation should not be a promotion or advertisement of a company or product.

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

- Please proofread your abstract carefully to avoid errors and to ensure the application is complete.
- Adherence to font size and margin requirement to ensure readability and fairness. Font size must be 11 points or larger. Provide at least one-half inch margins (½") top, bottom, left and right for all pages. Small text in figures, graphs, diagrams and charts is acceptable, as long as it is legible when the page is viewed at 100%. The following fonts are recommended: Arial, Georgia, Helvetica or Palatino Linotype.
- A maximum of three tables and three graphs/images can be included: a graph/image (in JPG, GIF or PNG with ideally 600 dpi) counts as 50 words, and a table counts as 10 words per row.
- Submit completed and signed application form and abstract to CHRI@sbch.org by 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, February 6, 2022.

ABSTRACT REVIEW

All submitted abstracts will be reviewed by at least two reviewers from multiple institutions. Applicants will be notified via email of abstract status by **Monday**, **February 28, 2022**.

Authors whose abstracts have been accepted will receive instructions for the presentation of their abstract.

Completing this form does not automatically ensure you can present at the Symposium nor does it register you for the event.
